Lori Williams, TMWA

Lori Williams, general manager of Truckee Meadows Water Authority (TMWA), will address our club on Monday, August 29th. She will update the membership on our water supply, water rights and future water resources, as well as TMWA's latest financial information and the water meter retrofit program. Many citizens and TMWA customers still have a lot of questions about this four-year-old community water utility. The intention is to leave plenty of time for Lori to answer any questions about TMWA that you may have -- so, bring them to this meeting.

No one knows the local water business, the Truckee River operation and the challenges related to water issues in the Truckee Meadows better than Lori Williams. As they say in the business, water runs through her veins. Lori was named TMWA general manager in 2002. Before that, she was director of water operations, serving in that capacity for both TMWA and Sierra Pacific Power Company. She has been in management of the local water business since 1986 and has been in the power and water business for more than 24 years, serving as plant supervisor, water distribution and maintenance supervisor, director of power and fuel contracts, and director of water policy and production. As general manager, Williams oversees all operations of TMWA.

Williams holds a Bachelor of Science Degree in Chemical Engineering from the University of Nevada Reno where she earned a Herz Gold Medal for Highest 4.0 GPA and the Mackay School of Mines Scheid Trophy. She has Grade IV Certifications from the State of Nevada in both Water Treatment and Water Distribution. She is a fourth-generation Nevadan, born and raised in Reno.

TMWA, serving over 85,000 customers in the Truckee Meadows, was formed by a joint powers agreement between the cities of Reno and Sparks and Washoe County when Sierra Pacific sold its water division in June of 2001.

PLACERVILLE WINE TASTING TRIP


