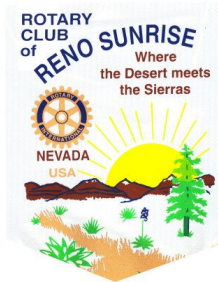
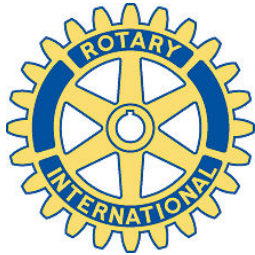

ROTARY YOUTH PROGRAMS

RYLA, RYE, Interact, Rotaract; what do they all mean? These are all Rotary youth programs.

In our Rotary District RYLA (Rotary Youth Leadership Award) is a one week summer camp for high school students who have completed their junior year. Former participants call the experience *life changing* and *fabulous*. The program currently includes a ropes course, a personality inventory survey as well as lots of outdoor exercise. All costs for the students are paid by Rotary clubs. We usually send 2 students to RYLA.

RYE (Rotary Youth Exchange) is open to high school students from ages 15.5 to 18.5. These students spend a year in another Rotary district, living with host families and attending the local high school. All travel expenses are paid for by the RYE student's family. Currently our district sends out 20 – 25 students and hosts the same number of young people. We usually host one in-bound and sponsor one out-bound student. Currently we are the host club for Marina Lima from Brazil.

Interact is a Rotary club for high school students. Interact clubs have a school counselor and a sponsoring club advisor. Interact clubs are expected to have a community project and to hold fund raisers to cover that cost. There are many Interact clubs in D 5190 but none currently in our area (area 8).

Rotaract is a Rotary club for 18 to 30 year olds. Rotaract clubs can be based at a college or university or can be community based. Reno Rotaract is a community based club. A Rotaract club has a sponsoring Rotary club which assigns an advisor to the club. Rotaract clubs are exactly like Rotary clubs except they meet every other week. They have officers, community and international projects and pay their own way to district events. Our club is a sponsoring club of the local Rotaract club.

INTERACT - ROTARACT

Interact is Rotary International's service club for young people ages 14 to 18. Interact clubs are sponsored by individual Rotary clubs, which provide support and guidance, but they are self-governing and self-supporting.

Club membership varies greatly. Clubs can be single gender or mixed, large or small. They can draw from the student body of a single school or from two or more schools in the same community.

Each year, Interact clubs complete at least two community service projects, one of which furthers international understanding and goodwill. Through these efforts, Interactors develop a network of friendships with local and overseas clubs and learn the importance of: developing leadership skills and personal integrity, demonstrating helpfulness and respect for others, understanding the value of individual responsibility and hard work and advancing international understanding and goodwill.

The first Interact Club met with 23 students at Melbourne High School in Melbourne, Florida in 1960. It has since become one of the most significant and fastest-growing programs of Rotary service; with more than 10,700 clubs in 109 countries and geographical areas, Interact has become a worldwide phenomenon. Almost 200,000 young people are involved in Interact.

ROTARACT---is a service club for young men and women aged 18 to 30 with around 185,000 members in 9,000 clubs in 155 countries; Interact is addressed above; and Rotary Community Corps (RCC)---a volunteer organization with an estimated 103,000 non-Rotarian men and women in over 4,400 communities in 160 countries. Chartered on March 20, 2006, Reno Rotaract is an active community based organization. They are sponsored by *Reno Sunrise Rotary* and the *Rotary Club of Reno*, making us true "partners in service" and an integral part of the Rotary family.

Through Rotaract, young adults not only augment our knowledge and leadership skills, we address the physical and social needs of our community while promoting international understanding and peace through a framework of friendship and service. Additionally, the club strives to ensure members a balanced service program, while providing the opportunities for personal and professional development. Reno Rotaract, like the parent organization Rotary International, is diverse.
