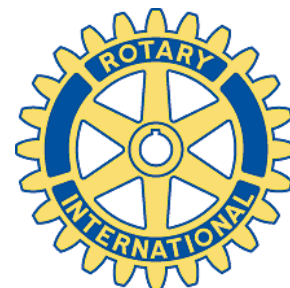

We just received great news! Martha Eisenhour, Reno Rotaractor and our candidate for a District 5190 Ambassadorial Scholarship came in first during interviews with the District selection committee a few days ago. So, she will receive one of the two District scholarships for 2012-13.

As reported previously, her first preference for the studies is Trinity College Dublin (Ireland) & Belfast (U.K.), and Martha's focus would be post-conflict peace transformation. The Rotary Foundation will next work with her on university choices, and a final determination in the upcoming months. The scholarship is for one academic year and pays up to \$26,000 for tuition, room and board, travel and health insurance. It's quite an opportunity.

Past President Gary Bartlett tells me in the earlier years of Reno Sunrise we had several Ambassadorial Scholars and he was on the District selection committee. But we haven't had a candidate for a while, so this is quite rewarding.

- **SECOND.** High ethical standards in businesses and professions, the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations, and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society.
- **THIRD.** The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business, and community life.
- **FOURTH.** The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.

1. Is it the TRUTH?
2. Is it FAIR to all concerned?
3. Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?
4. Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?
