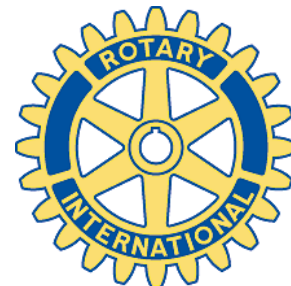

July Club Service Project **Saturday, July 30th 1-3pm**

This Saturday afternoon from 1-3pm we will be helping the Food Bank of Northern Nevada prepare packages of food for various community assistance organizations. We can provide up to 23 volunteers who are willing to provide *Service Above Self*.

The Food Bank is located east of the Reno-Sparks area about 16 miles on I-80 in the Tahoe-Reno Industrial Complex which is exit 32 - USA Parkway. Turn left on Italy Drive to their building at 550 Italy. It's called the Donald W. Reynolds Distribution Center and opened in 2008. Enter through the side entrance marked "Volunteer Entrance", sign in at the volunteer room, and then go to the warehouse where the volunteer supervisor Dave will be. We have been advised to arrive about ten minutes before 1pm, and also to wear close toed shoes for safety reasons.

We need your assistance and encourage you to bring family members and friends (over 10 years of age) who would like to help. So, please sign-up at Friday's meeting if you haven't already. And also pick-up a Reno Sunrise Rotary apron to wear, if you don't have one. We hope to see there!

The Object of Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster:

- **FIRST.** The development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service.
- **SECOND.** High ethical standards in businesses and professions, the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations, and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society.
- **THIRD.** The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business, and community life.
- **FOURTH.** The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.

The Four-Way Test

The test, which has been translated into more than 100 languages, asks the following questions:

Of the things we think, say or do

1. Is it the TRUTH?
2. Is it FAIR to all concerned?
3. Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?
4. Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?
