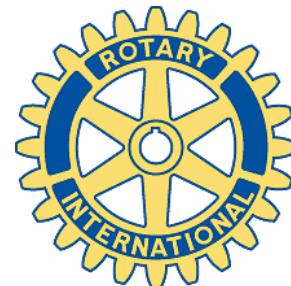

The next step in implementation is for you, each member, to login to our Club Runner website, review your data and profile, make corrections, changes or additions. If you are able to, we would like you to upload a photo of yourself, too. If not, we will make arrangements to have your photo taken and added.

Once you have logged in, you will be able to change your temporary password by clicking on "Change My Password". You will also be able to "Edit My Profile" and "Upload My Photo". When editing your information click on the "Rotary" tab and add "Rotary Member Designations" by checking the appropriate boxes and adding comments or years on the right.

Once completed this club directory will provide us all with useful information about your fellow members. You will be responsible for keeping your data up to date, so as changes occur we need you to login and make them.

The Club Secretary and President will now be able to generate various reports such as rosters, attendance, birthdays & anniversaries, and others. Also, Club Runner is a great communication tool as we will be utilizing it for EBulletins and Evites that can take the place of signup sheets for club activities. So, we appreciate your help in making this new tool a reality.

The Object of Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster:

- **FIRST.** The development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service.
- **SECOND.** High ethical standards in businesses and professions, the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations, and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society.
- **THIRD.** The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business, and community life.
- **FOURTH.** The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.

1. Is it the TRUTH?
2. Is it FAIR to all concerned?
3. Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?
4. Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?
