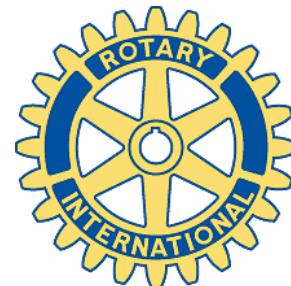

### Prez Sez.....

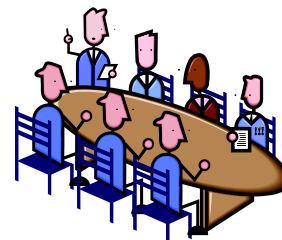
This Friday at our Club Assembly, after our normal agenda and club business, we will be discussing several issues. First is a revision to our club bylaws that I sent out on the 18<sup>th</sup> including the reasons for the changes. We have had some additional changes suggested this week, so we'll discuss and answer any questions you may have. The revisions, once finalized, require 10 days notification to the membership, and a two thirds approval by the membership. So, we'll probably vote at the meeting on the 10<sup>th</sup>.

Second, we'll discuss the new 501(c) (3) Reno Sunrise Charitable Foundation and provide an update on its progress. Our Board's Special Committee and I will provide the update.

And then we'll review progress toward the seven goals for the year that we discussed in July. We are doing well on most except for membership, where as most of you know, we have recently lost three members. Keith Weeks resigned effective December 31<sup>st</sup> for financial and family reasons. Helen Graham resigned effective January 10<sup>th</sup> because she has been unable to make our Friday morning meetings for business reasons. She will, however, most likely join another local club and remain in Rotary. And last Friday, Dan St. John announced he has accepted a job offer in Petaluma and will be leaving the area soon. Our goal for the year is to increase membership by a net of three, and with only one addition, we are down a net two.

So, we'll have a discussion at each table on ideas for recruiting new members, and then share those suggestions with the membership. Hopefully this exercise will be productive and fun.

Safe Kids Washoe County (SKWC) is a community coalition dedicated to the reduction of childhood injuries and deaths and is part of Safe Kids USA. Each Safe Kids coalition has a lead agency that provides administrative support. In this area Melissa Krall, Director of Community Outreach for REMSA, is the coordinator.

Reno Sunrise has been a member of SKWC since 2005. There are two community projects with SKWC – Not Even for a Minute and Give Kids a Boost: The Sun Valley Health & Safety Fair. Not Even for a Minute is a public awareness program reminding caregivers not to leave a child in or near an unattended motor vehicle. Give Kids a Boost started as the Virginia Palmer Health & Safety Fair. Within two years it outgrew the facilities at Palmer and moved to the Sun Valley Community Center. At the same time the Northern Nevada Immunization Coalition offered to be the lead agency for the fair and has done so for the past two years. This year it will be held on April 28<sup>th</sup>.

The mission statement of SKWC is “We believe that children should grow up safe, healthy and injury free. Our programs focus on injury prevention for children aged 0-14. Accidental injury is the number one cause of death among children ages 14 and under in the U.S., and annually, one out of every four children need medical attention for accidental injury. Safe Kids creates programs that reduce injuries through educating adults and children, creating safe environments, conducting research and advocating for effective laws.”

- THIRD. The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business, and community life.
- FOURTH. The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.

1. Is it the TRUTH?
2. Is it FAIR to all concerned?
3. Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?
4. Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?
