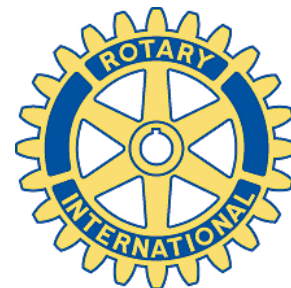

Prez Sez.....

February 23rd marks the 107th anniversary of Rotary's founding in 1905. Rotary has come a long way since that initial evening meeting in Room 711 of the Unity Building on Dearborn Street in downtown Chicago, which was the office of mining engineer Gus Loehr. It was the idea of a young attorney, Paul Harris, who brought along a business acquaintance Silvester Schiele, a coal dealer and client from time to time. Gus invited his friend Hiram Shorey, a merchant tailor. Each introduced themselves and shared information about their vocations and backgrounds that led them to Chicago.

Paul Harris proposed they form a club different from any other, one which he described as "a very simple plan of mutual cooperation and informal friendship such as all of us had once known in our villages." One member would be invited from each profession or line of business, and only those whose integrity the other members could vouch for would be invited. It would be a club where reciprocal trade could be practiced, but also one where they could all enjoy fellowship. They agreed to meet again in two weeks and pledged to recruit new potential members, and bring them to the next meeting.

The second meeting was held at Paul's office and there were three guests. Silvester hosted the third on March 23rd with 15 attendees present. This was the first real business meeting at which decisions were made, some of which the organization still honors today. After much discussion and many proposals, the name Rotary Club, suggested by Paul, was unanimously approved. Also, a board of directors was elected, and after Paul Harris declined, Silvester Shilele was elected the club's first President. Paul preferred to work behind the scenes to attract new members and shape the club's early character. By October the club had 30 members, and a year later had grown to 80.

And as they say, the rest is history.

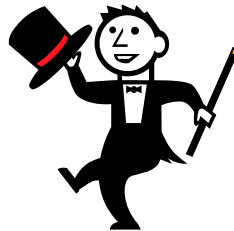

- **FIRST.** The development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service.
- **SECOND.** High ethical standards in businesses and professions, the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations, and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society.
- **THIRD.** The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business, and community life.
- **FOURTH.** The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.

The Four-Way Test

1. Is it the TRUTH?
2. Is it FAIR to all concerned?
3. Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?
4. Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?
